As part of your course you will undertake commercial experience, where you will learn and develop practical skills that will be vital for your future in countryside management.

What will I learn on the course?

Gain an insight into countryside industry practice, develop your understanding of ecology, conservation and deer management and learn more about a range of plants, trees and habitats.

Focus on the progression of British habitats, and the importance of good practice in soil cultivation, affecting wildlife and plants.

Develop your tractor driving skills and undertake commercial work experience.

What will this course cost me?

If you are aged under 19 years of age at the start of your course you will not have to pay any fees.

If you are aged 19 or over there may be support available, depending on your existing levels of qualifications. Please speak to our Student Support Team for more information.

You will be required to buy Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for this course. For a full list of equipment required <u>click here</u>.

What does a typical week look like?

This is a full time course taking place on three to four days per week from 9am - 4:30pm. There will be a mix of practical and theoretical work which are split into 1 hour - 2 hour lessons.



How will I be assessed?

Assessment consists of:

- Practical assessments
- Externally assessed Exams
- Assignments

Where can it lead to?

A Level 2 Diploma will give you the chance to progress to a Level 3 course or an apprenticeship.

Alternatively, you may go on to be an assistant park ranger, groundsman, estate worker or assistant park manager.

What are the entry requirements for this course?

Four GCSEs at grade 2-3 (D-E) or above or a Level 1 Diploma in a related subject.

How will this course help me to understand environmental and sustainability issues?

Sustainability is a theme throughout the course however the course also specifically includes:-

- Planting a variety of different trees to encourage biodiversity
- Laying old hedges- Gapping up hedges to create full wildlife corridors
- Working with the Farm on Beetle Banks, to help combat flooding due to heavy rain
- Native grasses planting programme
- Development of a sustainable woodland plan for the College
- Improvements to the freshwater habitats at the College
